

## From the Desk of the Principal

#### Greetings from Maibang Degree College

Maibang Degree College was founded on 5th September, 1988, the day on which the great educationist, the first Vice President and the second President of the India Dr. S. Radhakrishnan was born. Right from the time Late Bhadreswar Bodo became the Principal of Maibang H.S. School, he planned of opening a Degree College at Maibang because his own students had to go for higher education at least to a distance not less than 65 kilometers. Some of the H.S. passed out students had to give a full stop to educational achievement in spite of their having aspiration for the same only because of the poor family background to afford education outside. He shared his intention with the educated class of the people and the senior citizens of the locality and finally founded Maibang Degree College. A person who remained as a shadow with Late Bodo and later provided his services as the President of the Governing Body of the college is Mr. J. L. Jidung. The college was founded on the fifth September, in the hope that one day the college will also be of great reputation provided the coming generations understand the importance of the date. Since its foundation Late Bhadreswar Bodo was the Principal of the college till his retirement on 9th January, 2006. From his retirement I have to serve as the Principal i/c of college till today.

The college is situated near the historical capital city of the Dimasa Kingdom, presently known as Purana Maibang (Meghanarayanpur). It is about 3 K. M. distant from Maibang Town. The college is having a beautiful compound comprising 125 bighas of land with a Botanical Garden maintained by Maibang Aforestation Range of the Forest Department. The scenic view of Maibang Town, Mahur river, the Railway line and the National Highway from Maibang Degree College Campus and the Botanical garden of the college attract the visitors which urge a next visit to the college campus.

The college was brought under deficit Grant-in-aid system from 1st April, 2001. The college office and the classes were held in the evening shift at the premises of the H. S. School till 2004 for the lack of infrastructure in its original campus and for the convenience of the students and staff of the college. After shifting of the college to its present campus the students and the staff faced lots of problems with the poor infrastructure of the college. The development of the infrastructure started with the construction of six classrooms with 10 lakh financial grant from the N.C.Hills Autonomous Council during the tenure of Late Bodo.

Since the date of my taking over the charge as the Principal i/c of the college, my prime interest for the college has been development of infrastructure of the college and academic advancement. Now, with various grants received from the Government of Assam and N.C.Hills Autonomous Council the college is equipped with a modern library with computer and Wi-Fi facilities, state of the art furniture for the teaching and non teaching staff and the library, modern teaching aids including projector, computerized office, X-erox facilities etc. Almost 75% of the boundary wall for the vast compound of the college is already completed.

The Administrative Building, Separate Departmental Common Room for the faculties, Common Rooms both for boys and girls, NCC and NSS Offices, Office of the Maibang Degree College Students' Union are inaugurated in the session 2016-2017. Two numbers of two storied buildings are used for class rooms and seminars/workshop/conferences etc. The Library is also shifted to these two storied buildings. The college is at present equipped with Eleven numbers of Teachers' Quarters, Guest House, Rotary and Watch Tower. Dishru Girls' Hostel and Bhadreswar Bodo Boys' Hostel with twenty four capacity of seat in each hostel are inauguarated by the Hon'ble Chief Executive Member (CEM) of NC Hills Autonomous Council, Shri Debolal Gorlosa at a function on the 18th February, 2021. On the same day the statue of the founder principal Late Bhadreswar Bodo was also unveiled by the Hon'ble CEM. From this session the hostel facility will be offered to the students.

It is a matter of pride that a Language Lab and a Video Conferencing Room are also installed in the two storied building. These are in used and both the teachers and the students are using both the facilities.

The college has already started science stream with Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Zoology and Botany subjects. The construction of science building is going on and it is hoped that it will be completed in this academic session.

Maibang Degree College has handed over Eight Bighas of land to the B.Ed. College. The construction of the B.Ed college is going on at the land provided by this college.

The services of 34 Nos. of posts of the college are provincialised w.e.f. 2005 under Assam College Employees (Provincialisation) Act, 2005 vide Govt. of Assam Education (Higher) Department order No.AHE.98/2006/96, dated-17-03-2009 and the said act is extended to the Dima Hasao District vide Govt. of Assam Education (Higher) Department Notification No.AHE/98/2006/102-B, dated - Dispur, the 3rd August, 2009.

Through Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University study centre at Maibang Degree College in the year 2012, the facility of distance education up to MA is available in the college. The centre is offering BA (Both Major and Pass course) and MA in English, Political Science and Sociology to the learners who can not afford regular courses due to various reasons.

From the last three academic years, Assam University implemented the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in the undergraduate courses. I hope the students will be very sincere and regular in the classes to avail the benefits of the new system and the teachers and the office staff will render their services to their best. Let's work united for a brighter Maibang Degree College tomorrow.

#### Different components and distribution of marks for CCA

#### A. Full Marks & Pass Marks for CCA (Unit Test + Attendance)

Courses with only Theory paper: Full Marks = 30 (thirty) & Pass Marks = 12 (twelve)

Courses with both Theory & Practical papers: Full Marks = 20 (twenty) & Pass Marks = 8 (eight)

#### B. Unit Test:

#### i. Maximum marks:

Courses with only Theory paper = 20 (twenty) &

Courses with both Theory & Practical papers = 14 (ten)

- ii. There shall be two Unit Tests per semester and dates of such tests shall be notified by the Controller of Examinations. The highest mark scored by a student out of two Unit Tests shall be awarded to the student as the marks under Unit Test of CCA.
- iii. Unit Test may preferably be conducted during non-allotted classes, so that, total number of allotted classes (Lecture/ Tutorial/ Practical) are not curtailed. Setting of question paper and evaluation of answer scripts of Unit Test shall be done by the teachers of the concerned department of college. Marks obtained by the students be announced within one week of the Unit Test. If demanded, answer scripts of Unit Test be shown to students.
- iv. Marks scored in Unit Test for which the student appears as an "Arrear Paper" shall be carried over for declaring the result of concerned "Arrear Paper", only if the student secure Pass marks in the Unit Test else he/ she shall have to appear in Unit Test/s in the concerned paper along with the regular students.
- v. Mark sheets of CCA of each semester shall be despatched to the University by colleges during the period of End Semester Theory Examination for the concerned semester in the prescribed format and, in the most confidential manner well before the completion of that ESE.

#### C. Class Attendance:

- Class Attendance shall be calculated on the basis of actual number of classes held during each semester in each course/paper. Number of decimal be rounded off to next higher number (e.g., 74.01% be rounded off to 75%)
- ii. A student with less than 75% of attendance on an average of all the papers (excluding NCP Course, if any) of the concerned semester shall NOT be allowed to appear in that ESE but will be allowed to take admission in the immediate next higher semester. However, such a student may appear in the subsequent similar ESE (odd/even) in all the papers and, marks to be awarded under CCA for each paper shall be the marks previously secured by the student in the concerned paper, only if the student secure Pass marks in the Unit Test else he/ she shall have to appear in Unit Test/s in the concerned paper along with the regular students.

#### **Grading System**

#### Calculation of Credit Point, SGPA and CGPA

Step 1. For each course, marks secured by a student in ESE (including CCA, if any) will be converted to Grade Point (GP) on the basis of 10 -point Grading Scale as per the following formula:

Grade Point (GP<sub>ij</sub>) =

Step 2. Grade Point (GP) scored by a learner will be multiplied by the Credit (cr) assigned to the concerned Course and that will be the Credit Point (CP) for that particular Course. Thus, Credit Point (CPij) of the j<sup>th</sup> course of i<sup>th</sup> semester is given by

Step 3. Performance in a semester will be expressed as SGPA. Weighted average of the Credit Points of all successfully completed courses of the ith semester will be used to calculate Semester Grade Point Average of ith Semester (S<sub>i</sub>) as per the formula mentioned below:

- where cr<sub>ij</sub> is the Credit of j<sup>th</sup> course of j<sup>th</sup> semester and CP<sub>ij</sub> is as defined in (1),
   C<sub>i</sub> is the total credit of all courses under j<sup>th</sup> semester.
- Step 4. Cumulative performance of all the semesters will reflect overall performance in the whole programme. This cumulative performance is expressed as Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) and it will be calculated as the weighted average of all the SGPAs (S<sub>i</sub>; i = 1, 2, ..., 6) where the weights are the total credit of each semester (C<sub>i</sub>; i = 1, 2, ..., 6). Hence, the formula for CGPA is

#### COMBINATION OF SUBJECTS:

Regarding combination of subjects, the rules of Assam University, Silchar and the decision of the Admission Committee is final and binding.

#### **DROPPING OF HONOURS:**

Dropping of honours subject in subsequent semester will be allowed as per university instructions.

#### **ADMISSION PROCEDURE**

- 1. Admission to the College is through online process only in the prescribed Application Form available in the college website.
- 2. Notice prescribing the last date of Admission is hung up in the college notice board and college website usually a few days before or after the declaration of qualifying examination.
- 3. The Admission Form must be filled in completely in all respects and the hard copy of the Application must be submitted with the supporting documents. Incomplete Form(s) will be rejected straightway.
- 4. Admission process is conducted under the direct control of the Admission Committee. In case of admission to the Honours Course, the concerned department may hold interview/admission tests immediately before or after the admission if it is felt necessary by the department(s).
- 5. Admission is strictly on merit and is governed by the admission rules framed by the Admission Committee. The decision of the Chairperson of the Admission Committee stands final.
- 6. Any undue pressure or interference in the matter(s) of admission will be treated as disqualification.
- 7. The self attested copies of the following documents (two Copies each) are to be furnished along with the Application Form:
  - Mark Sheet, Certificate, Admit Card and Registration Card of HSLC, HS and other qualifying examinations.
  - Character Certificate.
  - SC/ST/OBC/MOBC Certificate.
  - Permanent Residential Certificate.
  - Gap certificate from appropriate authority in case the student who passed the qualifying examination earlier than the current year.
  - Original Migration/Transfer Certificate for the students seeking admission other than in the 1st Semester.
  - Latest Passport size photograph. (4 copies)
- 8. The original copies of the attested documents must be produced before the Admission Committee.
- 9. Presence of the Candidate on the date of interview/admission before the Admission Committee is compulsory.
- 10. The fees for admission must be paid on the date of admission after the approval from the Admission Committee.
- 11. No request for admission will be entertained after the prescribed date(s) fixed by the authority.
- 12. There is reservation of seats for the students belonging to SC, ST(P), ST(H), OBC (including MOBC) and Physically Handicapped (PH) categories as per Government rules. Valid certificates issued by the competent authority must be produced in original before the Admission Committee on the date of admission and the Xerox Copy must be attached with the Application Forms. The reservation of seats is as follows: SC 7%, STP 10%, STH 5%, OBC/MOBC 15% and PH 3%.

- 13. Admission in other semesters i.e. 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>. 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> will be completed within 7 days after completion of the earlier semester examinations on provisional basis. The provisional admission is to be regularised (for those who fulfill the eligibility conditions of the University) within seven days from the publication of the results of the earlier semester.
- 14. Request for permission for late admission shall not be entertained.

#### **ADMISSION FEE STRUCTURE**

#### (FOR THE SESSION 2021-22)

The Government of Assam has waived any Admission Fee for the students. Hence the student will have to pay only Registration and Examination Fees of the Assam University during online application for the same. However, the students will have to pay the Bus Fee at the starting of each semester.

#### **EXTRA CURRICULAR AMENITIES**

#### > STUDENT BODY OF THE COLLEGE

**MDCSU** (Maibang Degree College Students' Union) is the student body in the college. The student body has its own constitution. All office bearers are directly elected / selected by the students from among them for a term of one year. MDCSU organizes various co-curricular activities from time to time. The most important event organized by it is the "Annual College Week" which generally is held after the Odd Semester Examination. #### ➤ NSS

#### ➢ GIRLS' HOSTEL

#### GENERAL RULES FOR MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE IN THE COLLEGE

At the time of admission, the students and the parents/guardians are required to furnish an undertaking in respect of the students' regular attendance in the classes and appearance in the college and university examinations as per guidelines/instructions as specified by the concerned authorities.
- 4. The rules concerning the attendance in the classes of the students are strictly maintained in accordance to the instructions of Assam University, Silchar which is notified by the college authority at the beginning of the academic session. The rules for **non-collegiate and dis-collegiate** will be strictly adhered to.
- 5. The rules concerning college examination are strictly according to the Examination Committee of the college. And for university examinations the eligibility conditions and instructions of the university will be strictly followed.
- 6. The following activities of the students in this college will be treated as serious offences. All powers for disciplinary action against the offences are vested with the Principal and the Academic Committee of the college and their decision shall be final in all such matters.
  - i) Encouraging and participating in ragging of any type.
  - ii) Forcible disruption of classes.
  - iii) Destruction of college properties.
  - iv) Misbehaviour shown towards girls, women, teacher and employees of the college.
  - v) Uses of drugs, alcohol, narcotics, smoking inside or outside the college premises.
  - vi) Providing any wrong information to the college authority.
  - vii) Damaging and losing of library books of the college.
  - viii) And any other activities that may detriment the academic atmosphere of the college.
- 7. Students are to keep the photo-identity card of the college with them in the college premises and they may have to produce it on demand. Principal's signature over the identity cards shall be affixed within 15 days from the date of admission. The identity Cards are to be renewed at each semester. The old identity cards are to be submitted for renewal at the beginning of the new semester. Loss of identity card must be reported to the college office immediately and applied for a duplicate one with proper documentation and cost.
- 8. College uniform for the students is a must while they are in the college campus during routine hours (except for NCC/NSS/cultural/sports practices/activities)

- 9. Use of mobile phone by the students within the classrooms, examination halls and in any of the meetings of the college is strictly prohibited.
