From the Desk of the Principal

Greeting from Maibang Degree College

Maibang Degree college was instituted on 5th September 1988. Significantly it was brought into existence on the birth of Dr Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan in essence of imparting value and quality education. Since then Maibang Degree College has been working relentlessly on its mission ‘‘Searching for Knowledge and Excellence’’. Folk of the senior citizen, educated youth led by the educationist Late Bhadreswar Bodo pioneered the institution. The journey of higher education at Maibang was set for the necessity of education across the hilly terrain among the youths enrolling student of weaker sections. It enhances the role of higher education in the District of Dima Hasao in Assam situated in an area of 112 bigha plots of land including the Botanical garden at one of the oldest capital of the Dimasa Kingdom called Maibang.

The office of the principal was glorified by the Late Bhadreswar Bodo who was the first principal of the institution. His noble guidance invigorates Maibang Degree College narrating the story of dedication and sacrifice. He retired on 9th January 2006 and it situated Sri Dibyajoti Hazarika to officiate the administration till 5th January 2023. My tenure as principal of Maibang Degree College is enforced on 5th January 2023. It enacts me to patronise the grandeur of the institution in pursuit of knowledge and excellence.

Maibang Degree College was embodied by bringing in deficit-grant-in-aid system on 1st April 2001 and meanwhile provincialized on 1st December 2005. It has been ascertaining the needs and prosperity of the tribal and non-tribal imparting the right to knowledge and information heightening the stature of education as time passed. However, the journey of the institution was initially uneven crucifying the fact of poor infrastructure and other allied facilities. But it becalms all hurdles amplifying pure workforce and selfless dedication of the people and assistance of the Government of Assam, North Cachar Hills Autonomous Council and Prime Minister Uchchar Shiksha Abhiyan (PM-USA). The teaching fraternity justifies the process of teaching and learning by specialization to deal with the curriculum for the General and Honours courses.

As such Maibang Degree College is now enlarged in its scope, function and infrastructure enabling facilities of a Library with SOUL software, Smart Classroom, Departmental Teachers’ Common Room, Conference

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Room procuring technology assets, Language Lab, Science Laboratories, College Canteen, Staff Quarter, Girls' Hostel, Boys' Hostel, Guest House, separate Common Rooms for boys and Girls, Offices of the MDCSU, NCC both boys and Girls, NSS and MDC Alumni. Indeed, the core aim of the institution is to benefit the students and it is accustomed by NCC and NSS. Two building for Science Stream are already used as class rooms and another building for Science Stream is under construction.

Maibang Degree College has been imparting an undergraduate level of education in Arts streams. The institution has been strengthened recently by the initiative of the Government of Assam and North Cachar Hills Autonomous Council to introduce Science courses. Necessary steps are being taken for the appointment of teaching and non-teaching staff. It would fertilize the yard of higher education in the district of Dima Hasao familiarizing science education.

Academic Year (2023 – 2024) was a glorious year for the college. It has successfully completed the 1st Cycle of NAAC Assessment. For the preparation of the SSR of the college, the IQAC and the NAAC Steering Committee of the college worked hard to digitalize the required data from 2017 academic session. For this team effort, Maibang Degree College is successful in attaining the status of the single Grade B College with 2.37 CGPA Score in the District of Dima Hasao in the 1st Cycle of NAAC Assessment.

Maibang Degree College has been successful in fulfilling the dreams of the aspirants for Undergraduate and Postgraduate studies through the study centre of Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University (KKHSOU) since 2012.

I am committed to work on the mission and vision of the college which is to foster students, teachers and the wider community with the proper knowledge to cope with the rapid technological changes in teaching and learning through effective communication in multicultural and multilingual settings.

Message *from the Coordinator* *IQAC*



It gives me immense pleasure to share my gratitude to the faculty members of the college on selecting me as the Coordinator of IQAC & NAAC Steering Committee of the college in its general meeting on 6th January, 2023. I feel highly honoured to take the responsibility.

Before my joining the additional responsibility as the IQAC Coordinator, the College authority had already submitted the Institutional Information for Quality Assessment (IIQA) for the 1st cycle of NAAC Assessment of the institution on the 29th December, 2022. Therefore, immediately after taking the chair of the coordinator I had to respond to the series of queries to the IIQA and finally IIQA was approved on the 6th March, 2023.

The next task was the preparation of the Self Study Report (SSR) of the institution. With the full cooperation of the former Principal i/c Sri Dibyajyoti Hazarika, the Present Principal i/c Sri Sujit Kumar Sinha and Joint Coordinator of NAAC Steering Committee, Sri Pranjit Sarma and the Criterion Conveners of the NAAC Steering Committee the preparation works for the SSR was completed within the stipulated time of 45 days of IIQA approval. The preparation of the SSR was really very difficult task as most of the data required were not systematically stored, processed and digitalized for the entire period of assessment. The Principal i/c, myself and Pranjit Sarma worked day and night for the preparation of the SSR. The stage of Data Validation and Verification (DVV) of the assessment process was also completed by responding to a total of 37 numbers DVV clarifications sought by the NAAC authority. The SSR was finally approved on 22nd June, 2023 and The Peer Team Visit dates were fixed on 17th and 18th October, 2023. We, the team started working for welcoming the Peer Team by bringing awareness among the stake holders of the college about the Peer Team visit and preparing the presentation before the Peer Team. We got the result of the assessment on 27th October. NAAC has accredited Grade B to our college with CGPA score of 2.37.

From taking charge of the Coordinator of IQAC amidst lots of works of IIQA clarifications, SSR preparation, DVV clarifications and Preparation for the Peer Team Visit, the IQAC could not do much to the expectations of an institution of higher education. However, during the last academic year, the IQAC of the college took up the following initiatives for the enhancement of the quality education:

The IQAC has introduced mentoring for the students. In its initiative syllabus for 03 numbers of Add on Courses have been framed and approved by the Governing Body. Among others signing of MoU with Lumding College, monitoring the free admission to the BPL students, preparing the academic calendar and class routine,

looking into the infrastructural development, outreach programmes of the faculties, helping the college authority in the processes of admission and the maintenance of the server of the college, Samarth e-govt suit, etc. are of worth mention.

Most of our students hail from socially and economically deprived sections and from the remote tribal villages. Therefore, to develop self confidence levels, IQAC with the help of support services has started providing Academic Counseling, Career Counseling, Induction Programme to the newly admitted students, Health awareness programs, Health check-up camps, intimate mentor - mentee relationship etc.

With the implementation of NEP 2020 from the Academic Year 2023-2024, the students have got the opportunity to study diverse subjects through the NEP curriculum of Assam University, Silchar. However, the shortage of classrooms in the college will have to be met by the Government Authorities and with the full coverage of the 8th semesters there will be shortage of teachers also. Hope the stake holders of the college will be successful in overcoming the challenges of imparting quality education the college may face in the coming days.

My best wishes to the new comers for happy learning experiences at Maibang Degree College.

COURSES OFFERED:

The College offers courses of studies leading to BA & B.Sc. (Four Year Degree course both in General and Honours Courses). The course is affiliated to Assam University, Silchar and is governed by the rules and regulations of the University. The courses comprise of Eight Semesters of Six months' duration each. The Degree is awarded on successful completion of Six/Eight semesters having passed in Six/Eight End semester examinations conducted by Assam University.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO 1st SEMESTER OF B.A / B.Sc.

For seeking admission to the first semester of B.A /B.Sc. a candidate must have passed Higher Secondary Examination or equivalent 10+2 Standard of Council/ Board recognized by the State/ Central government authorities.

COURSE STRUCTURE SUBJECTS AND COMBINATIONS

FYUG- Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) Bachelors of Science (B.Sc.)

a) Discipline Specific Core (DSC) subjects

Economics, Education, Bengali, English, History, Political Science and Sociology (for arts stream) and Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Zoology and Botany (for Science stream).

b) Discipline Specific Minor (DSC) Subjects:

Economics, Education, Elective Bengali, English, History, Political science and Sociology (for Arts stream) and Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Zoology and Botany (for Science stream)

c) Inter- Disciplinary Courses(DSM) Subjects

Bengali, Economics, Education, English, History, Political Science and Sociology (for Arts stream) and Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Zoology and Botany (for Science stream)

d) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):

1. General English, Alternative English and Communicative English (AECC)
2. Modern Indian Language (MIL) form either Assamese (ASML) or Bengali (BNGL) and Communicative Bengali.

e) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) Subjects:

Economics, Education, Bengali, English, History, Political Science and Sociology (for Arts stream) Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Zoology and Botany (for Science stream).

f) Value Added Courses (VAC) Subjects: NCC/NSS and Understanding India.

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The Primary guidelines regarding the implementation of NEP 2020 for Four Year Under Graduate (FYUG) by Assam University are the following:



ASSAM UNIVERSITY, SILCHAR

Primary Guidelines for implementation of NEP 2020 for UG courses of colleges affiliated to Assam University, Silchar.

In order to implement NEP 2020 from the session 2023-24 for UG courses in affiliated colleges following primary guidelines will be followed

1. UG curriculum for colleges affiliated to Assam University shall be a four year UG programme (FYUG) as per curriculum structure provided in Annexure-I. Option for lateral exit shall be free from additional 04 credit earning. In lieu of Project / Dissertation in VIII semester, students shall have option to take three additional courses as Discipline Specific Course which will be equal to 12 credits in total. However, students opting for project/dissertation will be given Honours with Research degree and students opting for additional three Discipline Specific courses in lieu of Project/Dissertation will be given Honours degree. It is decided that in their respective prospectus each college should categorically mention this. It is also resolved that all those three papers (DSC-452,453 and 454) should be of level 500.
2. Offering Four Year Under Graduate (FYUG) programme is mandatory for all affiliated colleges. However, the colleges/ Departments shall have liberty if Honours with Research be offered or not depending upon their infrastructural limitation. If Honours with Research is not offered in a particular college, respective prospectus should clearly mention this to avoid confusion amongst students.
3. Interdisciplinary courses shall have 04 baskets viz: Natural Sciences (NS), Social Sciences (SS), Humanities (HN) and Commerce & Management (CM). Students may opt for any one from those 04 baskets in each of I, II and III semester. Bunching of subjects in each basket shall be as per Annexure-II.
4. From Discipline Specific Minor students shall take two subjects related to his /her Discipline. Each such subject should of 50% of total credit allotted to this course. Viz; for Three Year UG programme each Discipline Specific Minor shall be of 13 credits and for Four Year UG programme each Discipline Specific Minor shall be of 17 credits. Assam University shall notify cluster of subjects from which Discipline Specific Minor (DSM) can be chosen. To be more precise it is decided that DSM - 101(3), DSM -201 (4) , DSM -251(3) and DSM-301(3) = 13 credits should be the first minor subjects in case of Three Year UG Programme (TYUG) and DSM-151 (3) DSM -252 (3), DSM-DSM-302 (3) and DSM-351(4) =13 should be second minor subject. For FYUG Programme DSM -401 (4) should be first minor subject and DSM -451(4) should be second minor subject.

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5. Students securing highest CGPA (above 6.0) and with no back paper shall be allowed to change his/her core course once only, after completion of second semester. However, if a candidate desires to make one of his/her minors to core then automatic change in the minor should be done as same subject cannot be opted as both core and minor. Also change of core may be allowed only within allied subjects.
6. 7.5 CGPA should be obtained by a student up to 3rd year for opting Honours with Research Degree in 4th year. However, for only Honours degree there shall not be any CGPA restriction. But students with arrear paper shall not be allowed to move to 4th year in any case.
7. Evaluation of 3 and 4 credit courses shall be out of 100 marks and that for 2 credit course shall be out of 50 marks.
8. IDC courses opted shall remain same for all three semesters. Semester wise change of IDC is not allowed.
9. For AEC courses, there shall not be any internal exam. Total Marks for AEC examination shall be 50 with two hours examination duration.
10. SEC shall have to be opted from either DSC or DSM. Evaluation method for SEC for Science stream shall be 50 (End Semester Theory)+30 (End Sem Practical/Project/Field work) + 20 (internal test of which 14 for test and 6 for attendance). The same for Arts and commerce shall be 50 (End Semester Theory)+20 (End Semester Practical/Project/Field work) + 30 (internal test of which 20 for test and 10 for attendance).
11. For EVS (VAC-151) evaluation method shall be 70 (End Semester exam) + 30 Internal/Assignment. Marks for Internal test shall again be divided to 20 for written test and 10 for attendance.
12. Evaluation method for VAC -101 (with practical) shall be same as that of SEC (with practical) and that of VAC-101 (Without practical) shall be same as VAC-151.
13. EVS in VAC-151 should be of 100 level and EVS included in Natural Science Basket as IDC should be of 200 level.
14. Publication / Presentation of papers out of Research Project/ Dissertation carried out in VIII semester is not mandatory. However, the project shall have to be presented before Departmental Research Committee and in presence of an external examiner during end semester examination. Total marks for the project shall be 300 of which 90

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shall be internal and 210 is for end semester examination. Out of 90 marks as internal, in case of Dissertation/Project, there shall be three progress reviews and each review shall be of 30 marks. Marks obtained by a student in each of the review shall be notified immediately. Review of progress shall be done by concerned supervisor in presence of Departmental Research Committee.

15. For all other courses evaluation method shall be of 70 marks (for End Semester Examination) and 30 marks (for Internal Examination). Marks for Internal test shall again be divided to 20 for written test and 10 for attendance.
16. Natural Science in IDC, shall not have any practical component.
17. For Subjects with practical's DSC -152, DSC -253, DSC -303, DSC-354 and DSC -404 shall be practical with 100 marks. Practical examination shall be held in presence of External Examiner.
18. For Subjects with practical DSM -251 shall be practical for first minor and DSM -351 shall be practical for second minor. Marks for practical examination shall be 100 each and examination shall be held in presence of External Examiner.
19. For VAC 151 (EVS), shall not have any practical component.
20. For opting DSC and DSM combination, clustering of subjects shall be as per ANNEXURE-III. DSC from one cluster and DSM from other cluster is not allowed. DSC, DSM and IDC cannot be the same subject.
21. All DSM courses shall be stand alone and students can select first minor subject and second minor subject according to their choice keeping total requirement of 17 credit for each minor but they cannot change the code of minor papers. viz: One student of Physics (Core) may have Chemistry as first minor in DSM 101 and Mathematics as second minor in DSM 151. But the other student of Physics (core) may have Mathematics as first minor in DSM-101 and Chemistry as second minor in DSM 151.
22. For Research with Honours students, DSC-451 paper shall be research methodology and content of this course shall be same across the subjects and across the disciplines. However, for other students, DSC 451 will be a usual 500 level paper.
23. **Any student interested to opt for Honours with Research should have 7.5 CGPA up to third year without any arrear.**
24. In lieu of MIL, Alternative English may be opted by a student.

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COMBINATION OF SUBJECTS:

Regarding combination of subjects, the rules of Assam University, Silchar and the decision of the Admission Committee of the college is final and binding.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

1. Admission to the College is through online process only in the prescribed Application Form available in the website of Samarth <https://assamadmission.samarth.ac.in/> and in the College Website <https://maibangdegreecollege.edu.in> The candidates have to compulsorily apply in both the websites.
2. Notice prescribing the last date of Admission is hung up in the college notice board and college website usually a few days before or after the declaration of the result of the qualifying examination.
3. The Admission Form must be filled in completely in all respects and the hard copy of the Application must be submitted with the supporting documents. Incomplete Form(s) will be rejected straightway.
4. Admission process is conducted under the direct control of the Admission committee. In case of admission to the 'Honours Course, the rules of Assam University and the decision of the concerned department will be binding.
5. Admission is strictly on merit and is governed by the admission rules framed by the ADMISSION Committee. The decision of the chairperson of the admission Committee stands final.
6. Any under pressure or interference in the matter (s) of admission will be treated as disqualification.
7. The self-attested copies of the following documents (two Copies each) are to be furnished along with the hardcopy Application Form:
 - Mark Sheet, Certificate, Admit Card and Registration Card of HSLC<HS and other qualifying examinations.
 - Character Certificate.
 - SC/ST/OB/MOBC Certificate.
 - Permanent Residential Certificate.
 - Gap certificate from appropriate authority in case the student who passed the qualifying examination earlier than the current year.
 - Original Migration/Transfer Certificate for the students seeking admission other than in the 1st Semester.
 - Latest passport size photograph. (4 copies)
8. The original copies of the attested documents must be produced before the Admission Committee.
9. Presence of the Candidate on the date of interview/admission before the Admission Committee is compulsory.
10. The fees (if there be any) for admission must be paid on the date of admission after the approval from the Admission Committee.
11. No request for admission will be entertained after the prescribed date(s) fixed by the authorities concerned.
12. There is reservation of seats for the student belonging to SC, ST (P), ST (H), OBC (including MOBC) and physically Handicapped (PH) categories as per Government rules. Valid certificate issued by the competent authority must be produced in original before the Admission Committee on the date of admission and the Xerox Copy must be attached with the Application Forms. The reservation of seats is as follows:
 - *SC-7%
 - *STP- 10%
 - *STH- 5%

*OBC/MOBC- 15% and

*PH- 3%

13. Admission in other semesters i.e. 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th will be completed within 7 days after completion of the earlier end semester examinations on provisional basis. The provisional admission is to be regularized (for those who fulfil the eligibility conditions of the University) within seven days from the publication of the results of the earlier semester.
14. Request for the permission for late admission shall not be entertained.

ADMISSION FEE STRUCTURE

(FOR THE SESSION 2024-25)

The admission fee structure is notified by the Principal following the direction of the Government of Assam issued from time to time.

The Registration and Examination Fees of the Assam University are to be paid during online application for the same.

However, the student will have to pay the Bus fee at the starting of each semester.

5. The rules concerning college examination are strictly accorded to the Examination Committee of the college. And for the university examinations the eligibility conditions and instructions of the university will be strictly followed.
6. The following activities of the students in this college will be treated as serious offences. All powers for disciplinary actions against the offences are vested with the Principal and the Academic Committee of the College and their decision shall be final in all such matters.
 - I. Encouraging and participating in ragging of any types.
 - II. Forcible disruption of class.
 - III. Destruction of college properties.
 - IV. Misbehaviour shown towards girls, women, teachers and employees of the college.
 - V. Uses of drugs, alcohol, narcotics, smoking inside the college campus.
 - VI. Providing any wrong information to the college authority.
 - VII. Damaging and losing of library books of the college.
 - VIII. And any other activities that may detriment the academic atmosphere of the college.
7. **Students are to keep the photo-identity card of the college with them in the college premises** and they may have to produce it on demand. The identity cards shall be made available to the students within 15 days from the date of admission. The identity Cards are to be renewed in each academic year. The old identity cards are to be submitted for renewal at the beginning of the new academic year. Loss of identity card must be reported to the college office immediately and applied for a duplicate one with proper documentation and cost.
8. College uniform for the students is a must while they are in the college campus during routine hours (excepts for NCC/NSS/cultural/ sports practices/ activities)
